



Settler	A person who settles in a new region
Citizenship	The legal rights of someone born in a particular country to be a member of a country
Immigration	The process of coming to a country in order to live in it permanently
Caribbean	the region consisting of the Caribbean Sea, its islands (including the West Indies), and the surrounding coasts.
stereotype	The idea that people have about what someone or something is like
origin	The beginning or cause of something, the place where something was made or came from, the place where a person was born
colonialism	The policy or practice of acquiring full or partial political control over another country, occupying it with settlers, and exploiting it economically
British Empire	An empire is a group of countries ruled by a single monarch or political authority.
Racism	Racism is the belief that people's qualities are influenced by their race and that the members of other races are not as good as the members of your own, or the resulting unfair treatment of members of other races
Prejudice	Prejudice is an unreasonable opinion, especially about a particular group of people, that is formed without thought or knowledge
Windrush Generation	relating to or denoting the people who emigrated from the Caribbean to Britain on the British ship the <i>Empire Windrush</i> in 1948



- **1945** the end of WW2
- **1948** (June 22<sup>nd</sup>) The HMT Empire Windrush ship from Jamaica docks at Tilbury, London.
- **1948** The British Nationality Act gives people who live in the British Empire the right to live in the UK.
- **1948** The NHS is created. Thousands of nurses from the West Indies will be recruited.
- **1968** Racial discrimination in housing, jobs and banking is made illegal. There are rising racial attacks on Black and Asian people in the UK.
- **2012** The arrival of the Windrush is celebrated in the opening ceremony of the 2012 London Olympic games.
- **2018** (June 22<sup>nd</sup>) The first Windrush Day is commemorated.
